Book Club (Rhéa Gravelle)

On Nov15, the author of the Inspector Stride Series, Thomas Rendell Currant came to talk to us about his books. They include: *The Rossiter File*, *Death of a Lesser Man*, and *Undertow* (shortlisted by the Crime Writers of Canada for the Arthur Ellis Award for Best First Novel). Thomas follows one of the first rule of “good writing” – he writes about what he knows, that is, he writes about Newfoundland so that the scenes and people he incorporates in his mystery novels have, to his readers, a “feel” of “reality” that draws them even deeper in his mysteries.

On Oct 25, we discussed Denis Chong’s book *“The Girl in the Picture: The Remarkable Story of Vietnam’s Most Famous Casualty”*. It is a very good book to read and to comment upon. It’s a true story about the people touched by the Vietnam War and life after the war in communist countries, especially the famous “Girl in the Picture”. The book is very well written and captivates its readers from beginning to end.
